Aims and objectives

Moving away from taken for granted assumptions, Doing Transitions stands for a focus on how transitions in the life course emerge and how they are interlinked across the whole life span from early childhood to later life. The projects within the research training group "Doing Transitions" explore not only established wide-spread transitions, such as entering school, working life or retirement, divorce or widowhood, but also less frequent transitions such as the transition away from the gender assigned at birth, children's placing out of home, transitions of women released from prison, staging one's own growing up on the internet, or entering the end of life phase.

In these studies analysis has focussed on modes of shaping transitions, especially the interrelation between discursive, institutional and individually ascribed practices on the one hand. On the other hand, cross-cutting dimensions of the constitution of transitions have been identified: interpersonal relationships, temporalities and materialities (especially physical, spatial and material dimensions). Studying how transitions are done, thus, implies a relational approach extending the 'doing' perspective to multiple agents, processes and practices.

The 3rd Doing Transitions International Conference addresses "Relational Perspectives on the Life Course" and brings together the "Doing Transitions" research group with other researchers concerned with conducting research on life course transitions in a reflexive and relational perspective. The concept of relationality will be discussed in terms of different theoretical dimensions and methodological aspects of transitions across the life course.
