Changing names and scopes of networks

If you wish to change the name and/or the scope of the netwok, please proceed as follows:

- 1. Any proposal for a change of name/scope of the network must be discussed in a network meeting (ECER).
- 2. After consultation with the Networks' Representative on Council, the convenors should prepare a paper for Council/ the group of Network Convenors consisting of:
- the proposed new name and descriptor
- a rationale for changing the name/scope of the network
- evidence that the proposed network's name/scope is not currently covered by existing networks
- 3. The Networks' Representative on Council will discuss the proposal with Link-Convenors during the annual Network Seminar in spring or during the Link Convenors Meetings at ECER, and then with Council during the June or September meeting. If both groups agree to welcome the proposal, the network will be able to change its name.
- 4. The changes to the network name and/or scope (description) will be placed on the EERA website as soon as possible after the approval.

- 'Training' is not sufficient; adaptability is essential; lateral and divergent thinking are central; criticality rather than compliance is needed...." (Jones 2015.)

 "'Professional learning' involves active learning; it is a continuing process; it focuses on enquiry, analysis, reflection, evaluation, further action; in its best forms it is collaborative; and it enables an approach which is not confined to a linear interpretation of future events and ways of working." (Jones 2015.)

WHAT IS IT TO BE A CONVENER?

- The roles of Convenors vary from Network to Network
- Each Convenor may take a different role in the Network
- The workload will be light, unless you want to take more responsibilities in
 - Chairing
 - Reporting to EERA office and council
 - Actively contributing to the development of the NW
 - Contributing to the development of EERA



conveners etwork

- The process should contribute to the following principles: transparency, legitimacy, openness, trust, and continuity. Information about the established process is available (website, network meetings, etc.).
- Normally, the process will be based on an election of Convenors by the participants in the network, during the ECER network meeting, based on a minimum of two nominations (from participants in the network).
- The group of Convenors should reflect EERA's diversity in terms of geographical representation and gender balance.
- The election is part of the network meeting agenda and is made known to minimally all network participants before the conference.



Procedure:

All the authors presenting in NW 1 in 2018 have been sent an email through the ConfTool bulk email system, asking for nominees:

"According to the EERA guidelines, we have to take care of the linguistic, geographical, and gender balance of the convener team. Thus, especially female candidates from the Southern, Northern and Eastern parts of Europe who necessarily are not native English speakers are most welcome. If you want to propose a candidate (including yourself) please let us know even before the NW meeting by sending an email to Professor Hannu Heikkinen, email hannu.l.t.heikkinen@jyu.fi

According to the EERA guidelines, the process will be based on a minimum of two nominations from participants in the network. Each of the candidates will have an opportunity to introduce her / himself in the meeting. The group of convenors will do the final decision afterwards, based on the nominations, and inform the result of the election by an email to all who have presented their research in ECER2018 in NW1 as well as the EERA office and council. "

The conveners of NW1 have also been asking through their personal contacts.
