Welcome

Michael Gessler welcomed everyone to the VETNET Assembly.

Reports

Horizon 2020 is a new agenda for European research; Michael reported on the positive achievement to have vocational education and workplace learning as part of the paper. EERA is making the paper available electronically.

The 2013 Programme

Michael Gessler reported on the development of the 2013 programme, for ECER and VETNET.

VETNET: with 102 proposals received with an 80% acceptance rate. There were some withdrawals. The programme consisted of 80 papers and 30 sessions representing much work. Michael, ably assisted by Ludger and Pekka, is to be congratulated on putting the programme together. People are encouraged to upload their papers on to the VETNET site.

The Journal

Funding has been gained from EERA to support VETNET"S development of an online open access, peer reviewed journal. It is to be inclusive of quantitative and qualitative research. The focus is now to get the Journal underway with an infrastructure, framework and process to enable the achievement of high quality. There is the opportunity to have a special editor for a specific edition.

There was discussion of general aspects related to the establishment of the journal. This included:

- the number of issues per year
- develop a list of special issues
- the VET areas identified in Martin's research can provide headlines for the focus of special issues
- put the list of issues to members to have input
- there can be both thematic and open issues alternatively
- and an open list to structure the issue
- it can be both paper based and web based
- develop a schedule for the editorial board

There is the question of open access and high quality – Michael reported that form his investigations, an open access on line journal can be rated.
