1. Welcome, how did you perceive ECER2021?

Overall, the online ECER went well from a technical point of view (also excellent assistance), the presentations were of high standards. However, real interactions and discussions went less fluently and many felt the lack of networking opportunities.

ECER2021:

- Submissions: positive surprise almost as big as offline ECERs: about 2000 presentations,
- Registrations: 2400
- NW3: little less presentations compared to earlier years

- 13-15 October 2021: International conference "Teachers Matter but How?", arranged at Linnæus University in Växjö. Main theme: Didaktik, pedagogy, and classroom research
- 23-26 August 2022: ECER2022 in Yerevan, Armenia

Name change:

Curriculum innovation network → Curriculum network

- We are about to change the name of our network to make clear that our network has a broader curriculum interest.
- Proposal (based on input of our members) has been approved with the link convenors in April
 2021
- Proposal will probably be approved by EERA council in September 2021

EERA activities and support:

- New options for network support, in addition to the existing funding (exploring connections for publication, network profiling), there are two new forms of support:
 - 1) max 3000 Euro for scientific development, capacity building, invite guest speakers
 - 2) celebrate special moments (have a drink during the ECER), max 250 Euro starts in the Fall of 2019, deadline 30th of Sept, 30 of May please check the regulations carefully
- EERA blog started January 2020 (for networks, national associations, EERA related events)
- EERA publishing initiatives, around 3 books per year, open access
- EERJ is in SSCI

- Curriculum Journal (Mark Priestley and Stavroula Philippou are the chief editors, the team of associate editors consists of Claire Sinnema, Daniel Alvunger, David Leat, Joseph Smith, Kathryn Hibbert, Tiina Soini and Nienke Nieveen)
 - The journal is in great shape
 - 450 papers (about 140 per year) around 50 papers per year have been published in four issues
 - SSCI is upcoming
- Dominik Dvořak raises attention to the possibility of organizing a English issue to a Czech journal aligned with the Czech Curriculum seminar/summer school (see point 3)
