

Network 4 participation at ECER 2020 has been characterised by the effort to move online the planned activities as much as possible. We received 205 submissions, 159 of which were accepted through a peer review process supported by 45 network's members.

After the conference cancellation, we invited the authors of accepted papers to present their contributions at the online meeting we organised on 26-28 August. 29 chairs helped manage the presentation and discussion of 87 papers, 8 posters, and 2 symposia in three parallel sessions, for a total of 258 attendants. 12 sessions were focused on the special NW call on “A Plural Self: (Re)connecting Communities Through Research on Inclusive Education”, which aimed to delve into the main conference theme. All contributions were collected in the book of abstracts and published online.

The network business meeting was held at the end of the sessions on 28 August. The feedback on the online meeting was very positive. Expressing appreciation of the meeting and the way it helped keeping the ECER conference spirit alive, participants recommended providing more breaks between sessions, to record the sessions and make them available online.

In view of the Geneva conference, participants also suggested that EERA should consider including some online sessions in the programme, taking advantage of the experience acquired in recent times on managing this meeting format.
