

# Network 25 Meeting – Minutes

Thursday 11.09.2025, 17h15-18h45

## 1. Welcome and presentations, agenda

21 attendees

Submissions to the Network have been growing over the years. A higher rejection rate than in previous years, based on the application of the Network's agreed-upon review criteria. The Network does not accept papers that do not address the two core focus aspects for the Network. Our criteria mean that our Network is among those with the highest rejection rates, but this helps ensure the quality and relevance of the presentations to the Network's focus. The Link Convenor explained the review process and cut scores. The Link Convenor advised that there was a high number of last-minute withdrawals and explained the implications for scheduling. They appreciated the flexibility of attendees in making adjustments when required.

Link Convenor displayed Network 25-related results from the EERA EduTopics tool and explained the rationale for the tool and how to access it. The most discussed topics for N25 over the past 20 years, as displayed by the EduTopics tool, were listed.

Reviewers for the 2025 Conference were acknowledged and thanked.

## **6. *ECER 2026***

- Attendees discussed whether to have a special call. Several possible topics discussed:
  - Children’s right to digital education, including online and offline rights, connection to mental health, violence, and democracy, as well as children’s experiences. Possible joint session with Learning Environment Network or Digital Network. Must have the child rights perspective AND the education aspect.
  - Democracy in education
  - Controversial topics in children’s rights and education
    - Possibility to have an open Zoom with other networks for the papers to be in dialogue on these issues
  - Understudied children’s rights issues
  - The convenor team will draft the special call on the controversial topics in children’s rights and education.
  - Link convenor reminded attendees that other topics can, of course, still be progressed independently of the special call, e.g. as a symposium

## **7. *Convenor team election 2025***

- The link convenor explained the regulations for N25 elections, the history of the designated convenor positions, as decided at the 2024 Annual Meeting (ECR), and the process for elections.
- Next year at the Network meeting, the new convenor team will propose a plan for Network members to discuss the process for Network elections in the coming years.
- Nominees provided a brief introduction prior to the vote.
- Attendees voted, while the election organiser (Rachel Shanks) counted the votes
- The Link convenor acknowledged the contributions of all nominees to the Network and thanked them for accepting the nomination.
- The votes were counted, and all three nominees received an equal number of votes. The position was decided by placing all nominee names in a hat and drawing one out. Chiara Monta was drawn.

- The convenor team for the coming period will be Zoe Moody (Link Convenor – elected in 2024), Jenna Gillett-Swan, Lotem Perry-Hazan, Gabriela Martinez-Sainz, and Chiara Monta (ECR position)
- Ann Quennerstedt (immediate past Link Convenor) was acknowledged and thanked for her contributions to the Network, having been a convenor since 2013 (12 years) and having been vital to developing the Network into what it now is today. Outgoing convenor Ioanna Palaiologou was also thanked for her contributions.
