- <u>Discharges:</u> Brian, Ingrid and Bernard have announced that they would like to be discharged from their convenor's duties (Ingrid and Bernard are now retired). - <u>New nomination</u>: Florence and Anke propose to nominate Isabelle Mili. Isabelle is Full professor in Didactics of music and arts, at the Faculty of Psychology and Educational Sciences at the University of Geneva, Switzerland. She is the head of the Geneva teacher training institute. As EERA council representative for the Swiss Association for Education

Research (SSRE/SGBF), she has submitted a proposal for ECER 2021 in Geneva (which has just been accepted by the EERA office, during the morning – well done!). The nomination of Isabelle Mili is put to vote and accepted unanimously by the Assembly. Welcome to Isabelle!

- <u>Honorary Network Membership proposal</u>: Anke and Brigitte have prepared a proposal for the nomination of Prof. Em. Meinert Meyer (University of Hamburg). HNM is a symbolic recognition of the strong involvement in fostering the aims and objectives of EERA through the networks.

Meinert has been Link Convenor of our network from 2012 to 2016, and he contributed to its establishment with Brian Hudson, in 2006. The detailed proposal (see Appendix) is read to the Assembly and put to vote. It is accepted by 27votes and 1 abstention.

The proposal will be sent to the EERA Council who will deliberate about it during its next session in April 2019. If accepted by the Council, the HNM will be awarded to Meinert Meyer at ECER 2019 in Hamburg.

(3) Report on ECER 2018 features and organisation

a) Submissions: trends and evolutions

Comments by Florence:

- The number of submissions is stable (around 58-90 every year), but there is a clear increase of the number of symposiums is this due to the good opportunities of making joint sessions in our network? The drawback of this number of symposiums is that they cannot all fit on Friday, and some of them have to be put parallel to paper sessions. Symposiums tend to be more attractive and it weakens the audience in the paper sessions.
- The rejection rate on the submissions is increasing (23%) compared to last year (18%) and previous years (around 10%). But since the number of symposiums increases, these figures do not reflect the true selectivity in NW 27, which is about 16% if we consider all papers (including papers in symposiums, posters, and round tables).
- The number of submissions we had to metareview (graded less than 6/10, and/or more than 2 units of standard deviation) has decreased. Last year, we meta-reviewed about 35 submissions, we only did 20 this year. Our reviewers get more experienced? Our submitters get a better insight of the type of proposal to be accepted?
- b) Feedback from the assembly what goes well here at ECER Bolzano / not well?
- We should have the opportunity to co-author the submission of a symposium in the Conftool system => this idea will be reported at the next LC meeting
- Certain Chinese PhD students had their paper rejected due to a lack of European perspective. Should this criterion be transformed in the reviewing form? Four years ago a reflection was initiated among the LCs about the reviewing criteria, but as far as we know, it was hard to find a consensus for some clear cut changes. In our network, reviewers get some guidance about it, in particular the "European perspective" criteria should be assessed in a broad view, including a more "international and cross-cultural significance". We also would like to warn submitters that their results should be interesting for a European audience: broaden the research question, include European literature, discuss the significance of the results in terms of larger didactic / educational issues (not just facts obtained from a survey). If the results seem too confined to a single national context, then it makes difficult to think about the relevance and use in another country or continent => read the arguments of NW27 on the website!
- Reminder: A few years ago, the Council has also improved the submission template, including a "result and discussion" section. This is a criterion for the assessment.
- Participants are invited to answer the e-survey by the EERA Office that is sent on the last day of the conference.
- c) Joint sessions: This year we managed to organise 11 JS (3 paper sessions, 3 single symposiums and 3 double symposiums)
 - NW3 Curriculum (1 symposium)
 - NW 13 Philosophy of education (1 symposium)
 - NW 16 ICT (1 paper session and 1 double symposium)
 - NW 31 Language education (1 paper session)
 - NW 33 Gender and education (1 paper session + 2 double symposiums)

- There is an obvious "follow up" effect of the Special Call on Gender (by C. Taylor, C. Amade-Escot & F. Ligozat): 1 paper session, 1 single session and 2 double symposiums shared with NW33. This a very good dynamic that we seek to develop through new special calls.

(4) Next topics for ECER 2019 in Hamburg

ECER 2019 will be held on the 1st week of September.

Ideas of special calls may be discussed and submitted by 15th. October 2018. At least one convenor should take part in setting a proposal. Proposals should reflect the heuristic power of didactic research traditions, in addressing broader educational issues. Suggestions by the Assembly:

- Isabelle Mili: Corporeality and embodiment related to the specificity of knowledge in teaching and Learning
- Anette Olin, Benoit Lenzen and Jonas Almqvist: teacher education development and collaboration between teacher and researchers.

Proponents are invited to get in touch with Florence / LC to arrange a schedule.
