2. General Information

2.1 – Weather in South Tyrol



The region is well known for its mild climate and pristine air in the first weeks of September. Expect an average daytime temperature of around 23°C, which means about 15°–18°C in the morning and about 24°–28°C during the day: it's best to leave the house with a long sleeved sweater or very light jacket and something lighter under it. Although nowadays it is almost impossible to predict weather conditions even in the short run, up to now chances of rainy days in September were low.

Check out the **App** called "**Weather South Tyrol**" for your mobile device.

2.2 – Getting around

Bozen-Bolzano is a small city, easy to navigate on foot and all conference venues are within walking distance in the city center. In case you come by car to Bozen-Bolzano, make sure to leave it where your accommodation is or park it for the day next to the train station.

Check out "City Parking Bolzano" on the web for more information and expect to pay 2,60 € / hr. Please remember that the city center is not accessible by car and open to public transport (busses) only. You can reach the University from the train station on foot in 8 minutes.

2.7 – Taxi

There are two providers in town when it comes to busses: **SAD** and **SASA**.

The first one serves mainly routes (bus and train) leading out of town and into the surrounding valleys. The second one provides transportation within the city boundaries and to Meran-Merano (line 201).

Most of the city busses **stop on Piazza Domenicani – Dominikanerplatz** just around the University's corner (see your ECER city map). Both service providers have apps with information in real time and route planning.

Want to cruise around on a bicycle? Get yours in Viale della Stazione, 50 meters South of Piazza Walther.

Rent one for $2 \in$ for 6 hours or for $5 \in$ for the day. Bring a valid ID with you and remember to return the bike by 20:00.

If you're going to use **public transport** you should definitely get a **MobilCard**.

It's valid from the Austrian border all the way to Trento (60 km South of Bolzano) and on all public transport for 1, 3 or 7 consecutive days. Go for the 3-day or 7-day option for $23 \in$ or $28 \in$, based on how long you're planning to stay. Visit www.mobilcard.info/en for detailed information.

2.8 - Important Numbers

Emergency number: 112. When you dial the European Unified Emergency Number you'll reach an operator near you who'll send rescue services based on your emergency. This includes the police, the fire fighters, ambulance, mountain rescue and more.

3. Emerging Researchers Conference

The Emerging Researchers Conference will take place on **Monday 3** and **Tuesday 4** of September in the University's C-Building.

3.1 - ERC - Coffee Breaks

There will be coffee breaks and lunches for both days of the Emerging Researchers Conference. The coffee stations will be located in the **corridors of the C-Building**, please **always wear your badge**. Use your **mug** for the coffee, wash and refill it with water afterwards or use your own bottle. As part of the green label policy we're not using plastic cups. In case you prefer Italian coffee (espresso...) head to the "**Unibar**" (main entrance, ground floor) or one of the Cafés around Piazza Università.

As an ERC participant you'll find a **lunch voucher** for each day of the Emerging Researchers Conference attached to your badge.

The Emerging Researchers' Conference will include four interactive poster sessions which will take place on **Monday, 3 September**. In these sessions, each presenter will give a **10 minute talk** about their poster.

We invite all ERC participants to visit the **ERC Poster Exhibition** on Tuesday during the coffee break 10:30 – 11:00. It will be located near the coffee spot in the C-Building, second floor corridor and you'll have a chance to view all posters and talk with their authors.



3.5 - Awards

Best Poster Award:

The winner of the ERC 2018 Best Poster Award will be **announced during the ERC Closing Ceremony** on Tuesday at 17:00. The award includes a free entry to next year's ERC and ECER Conferences in Hamburg and a travel grant of €500.

Best Paper Award:

After the Emerging Researchers' Conference, participants are invited to hand in full papers to the Best Paper Award. An EERA committee will review the submissions.

A paper can be submitted by more than one person (maximum three), but each person must fulfil the following criteria: All authors must be enrolled in a PhD program, or must have earned their PhD degree not longer than 6 years ago and must be in the early stage of their careers (not professors).


The successful author will be offered free entry to next year's conference in Hamburg, a travel budget and their paper will be considered for publication in the EERJ (European Educational Research Journal).


4. ECER Conference





4.4 - ECER Coffee Breaks

ECER 2018 will host a **General Poster Session** as well as **Interactive Poster Sessions** and **Paper/Poster Sessions**.

The General Poster Session, where the poster authors will be present to answer questions and discuss their posters, will take place on Wednesday, 12:00 to 13:30 in the corridors of Buildings C and D on the ground and first floors. The posters being presented in the Interactive Poster Sessions and Paper/Poster Sessions will not be exhibited in the General Poster Exhibition area but will hang for the duration of the conference in the network session room where the Interactive or Paper/Poster session will take place.

4.7 - Elsevier Best Poster Award

The winner(s) of the Elsevier Best Poster Award will be announced at the ECER closing ceremony on Friday 17:10 – 17:30.

All authors of the **winning poster** will receive a free subscription to an Elsevier journal of their choice and a cash prize of \$250. Furthermore, EERA will offer one free entry to ECER 2019 in Hamburg.

4.8 - Welcome Reception

You're invited to join your colleagues on Tuesday, September 4 at the **Maretsch Castle** for a couple of drinks and finger food. Enjoy jazzy alpine sounds by Revensch. The castle is located within the historic city center and was built in the 13th century as a residence for Enrico de Marets, who served count Mainhard II of Görz-Tyrol. It's present look dates back to 1560 and you're welcome to enjoy an evening of networking in this historical place. **The Reception starts at 19:00 and ends at 21:00**.

4.9 - Social Event on Piazza Walther

6. Green Event

For the first time ever, **ECER 2018 has been awarded a "green label"**. This means, that the conference's **ecological sustainability** has been put to the test and the result was extraordinary.

Here are just a few criteria for receiving the award:

ECER will be powered by electricity from renewable energy sources only (water power); plastic has been reduced to a minimum, therefore thousands of coffee cups have been substituted by a re-usable bamboo mug, we use pencils instead of plastic pens and more; the conference bag is made of bio-organic cotton; printing has been limited to an absolute minimum and much more!
