

1. WELCOME

Moin moin to all participants and welcome to ECER 2019 at the Universität Hamburg!

2. GENERAL INFORMATION

2.1 ARRIVAL IN HAMBURG

If you are travelling to Hamburg from out of town, consider taking the train. In addition to the central station, most trains also stop at Dammtor station, which is only a five-minute walk from campus and the conference venue.

If you arrive by aircraft, a train (S1) will get you straight to the city centre.

2.2. GETTING AROUND

2.3 PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Your ECER 2019 conference badge, which you will receive at check-in, will also serve as a pre-paid ticket for the HVV, the Hamburg public transport. It is valid from 2. – 6. September 2019. This is a 24-hour ticket for the entire Hamburg public transport system (trains, metro, buses and ferries).

2.4 BIKE RENTAL



If you would like to see more of Hamburg and get around without delays, renting a city bike is the best option! Check your ECER map to find the three city bike stations on campus and simply register via the StadtRAD homepage or the app. The first 30 minutes of each trip are free of charge. The registration fee of 5 € can be used as credit for future bike rides. Don't forget to cancel the contract after your stay, since it gets renewed automatically every year.

Please log in to the GUEST Wifi with the individual details on your badge.

Connect to the WiFi with SSID "GUEST". Establish the connection by entering the pre-shared key "**rrz-wlan**" (without the quotation marks). The login page should appear automatically. If not, start your browser and connect to <http://uhh.de>. You will be directed to the GUEST login page. Fill in your individual user name and password for the UHH WiFi GUEST. Each device you use to login will be registered. It will stay logged in until your account expires. Up to three devices can be registered. Additional devices will unregister the oldest device.

In the entrance of every building there will be an info point. Please feel free to ask here for directions. In the Check-in Tent you will find the Check-in Desks, Local Help Desk, Tourist Desk, Team Leader Desk as well as the EERA Desk.

3. EMERGING RESEARCHERS' CONFERENCE

3.1 ERC COFFEE BREAKS

3.5 AWARDS

Best Poster Award

The winner of the ERC 2019 Best Poster Award will be announced during the ERC Closing Ceremony on Tuesday at 14.30. The award includes a free entry to next year's ERC and ECER Conferences in Glasgow and a travel grant of 550 €.

Best Paper Award

After the Emerging Researchers' Conference, participants are invited to hand in full papers to the Best Paper Award. An EERA committee will review the submissions. A paper can be submitted by more than one person (maximum three), but each person must fulfil the following criteria: All authors must be enrolled in a PhD programme, or must have earned their PhD degree not longer than 6 years ago and must be in the early stage of their careers (not professors).

The successful author will be offered free entry to next year's conference in Glasgow, a travel budget, and their paper will be considered for publication in the EERJ (European Educational Research Journal).

The Best Paper Award is sponsored by MAXQDA/Verbi Software. The award will be presented to the Best Paper 2018 Winner during the opening of ECER, Tuesday, 3 September 11.00–12.30.

4. ECER CONFERENCE

4.1 LOCATION MAP

The winner(s) of the Elsevier Best Poster Award will be announced at the ECER closing ceremony on Friday 17.10–17.30. All authors of the winning poster will receive a free subscription to an Elsevier journal of their choice and a cash prize of \$250. Furthermore, EERA will offer one free entry to ECER 2020 in Glasgow.

6. GOING GREEN

The theme of this year's ECER refers to an era of risk. In our discussions about the uncertainties of the present and the future, we are not allowed to forget that our natural environment has been at risk for quite some time. Thanks to youth movements such as FridaysForFuture, global climate change has risen up the societal agenda with education playing an essential role in empowering the current generation to achieve their ambition of a better world.

In recent years, EERA and the various ECER local organisers have been tackling all aspects of conference organisation (such as registration, communication, travel, catering, waste disposal) to become more sustainable.

As part of its mandate, the Universität Hamburg aims to become a *University for a Sustainable Future*. It has therefore been immensely supportive of the ECER "Going Green", with the ECER even serving as a pilot for sustainable event management at the university.

We believe that we all have a responsibility to question our way of living and to act now. So let's ask ourselves: what can we do today to make our future greener? Even seemingly tiny changes can make a difference!

Here is what we have done and what all of you can do to join our endeavours, you can find more information on site at all "Green Points".

6.1 CONFERENCE CATERING

- Vegetarian and vegan options are available at the coffee breaks and are clearly marked at our catering spots. For lunch, go to the canteen on campus, which offers a salad bar

as well as several warm dishes including vegetarian and vegan options. On Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, you will find Street Food Trucks offering delicious vegan food near the check-in tent. And most of the restaurants near campus have at least one vegan option on their menu – so it will be quite easy to pass on meat for the ECER week.

- We serve only fair-trade tea and coffee. Regional, seasonal and organic products are used where possible.
- All fruit on offer at the conference catering spots comes straight from the *Altes Land* – an area located just south of Hamburg and one of Europe’s largest fruit growing areas. Specifically, the fruit comes from the *Eckhoff* family farm, which is now run by the 5th *Eckhoff* generation and according to strict guidelines of controlled, integrated cultivation.
- There won’t be any plastic cups at ECER 2019! When registering at the check-in desk you will receive a conference mug, which you can use throughout the conference (and beyond!) for all your drinking needs. If you want to explore the coffee shops on campus, but still want to keep it sustainable, simply ask the barista to fill the coffee straight into your own reusable coffee mug (some coffee shops even give a small discount for this).
- There won’t be any (plastic) bottled water either. Large water dispensers will be provided throughout the buildings, so feel free to bring your own bottle to refill.
- But also bear in mind that tap water in Hamburg is drinkable. Bring your own reusable water bottle and you will have a healthy, cheap and eco-friendly drink with you at all times.

6.2 RECYCLING

- Onsite, as well as all around Hamburg, a recycling and composting system is in place. Please make sure to use the appropriate bins. For this, just follow the colour code: **blue** is for paper trash (not for used paper napkins and tissues or greasy materials; these go to residual waste), **yellow** for recyclable materials (plastic and metal, e.g. coffee-to-go cups and tetra pak cartons), **grey** for residual waste (comprises all the rest and will be incinerated).



- The German deposit system: In Germany, most empty glass and plastic bottles, as well as some aluminium cans, are not trash. They are basically money! If you find the symbols on your bottle, you pay a deposit (*Pfand*) when buying it, which you can get back when you return the empty bottle at a shop.
- *Pfand gehört daneben* (Bottles belong next to (not in) trash containers). Since many people throw away their empty bottles instead of getting the deposit back, a campaign was initiated to encourage them to leave their bottles next to trash cans. This is not just sustainable but is also an act of solidarity towards people in need. Those living in poverty can just pick up the bottles, rather than having to search through trash cans, and return them for the deposit. So always remember: bottles do not belong in trash cans! Some collection points (old beer crates next to trash containers on campus) have been installed. If you don't want to return the bottle to a shop, just look out for these points on campus and leave your *Pfand* bottles there or at the *Pfand* tower located at the Catering Tent.

6.3 MOBILITY

- Use public transportation: Your ECER 2019 conference badge (which you will receive at check-in) also serves as a pre-paid ticket for the HVV, the Hamburg public transportation system, valid from 2 - 6 September.
- For short distances you can use the city bike rental. The first 30 minutes of each trip are even free of charge! (<https://stadtrad.hamburg.de/en/register>) Our local helpdesk staff will be happy to help you with registering for the bike scheme.

6.4 CO² FOOTPRINT

- EERA cooperates with myclimate, a Swiss non-profit organisation engaged internationally in climate education and awareness to support climate protection projects. We will ask each participant at check-in about their travel and whether any CO² footprint compensation could be carried out.
- After the event, myclimate will calculate the remaining, unavoidable CO² emissions of ECER 2019 and offset these in a climate protection project. We are aiming to achieve the carbon-neutral event label and obtain a carbon footprint for our event that is certified and confirmed by myclimate.

6.5 MATERIALS/RESOURCES

- Use the conference app and online programme. Please carefully consider whether printed handouts are necessary. If they are, use as little paper as possible by printing on both sides.

- All participants will have access to WiFi on campus. Just bring your own mobile device and you are good to go!
- We have tried to use eco-friendly material only for all print and promotion materials: the conference bag is made from fair trade organic cotton, the lanyards from recycled PET, while the booklet and programme have been printed on FSC certified recycled paper.
- The Universität Hamburg purchases its electricity exclusively from renewable energies. All cleaning products used in the buildings are eco-friendly.

6.6 SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

- The keynote sessions will be translated into International Sign Language, with subtitles added.
- We have put together some recommendations and special offers for families and kids on and near the campus. Please find more information in this booklet and on the website. You are more than welcome to connect with other families in the open playing room located at VMP5, 0046!
